## Relevant existing rules and regulations of the co-hosts

### Summary

Paragraph 26 of the hosting MOU, annexed to decision 6/CMA.5, endorsed in decision 2/CP.28, details that the Santiago network Secretariat shall administer, through UNOPS and, where required, UNDRR, in accordance with their respective regulations, rules and procedures, the funds that will be provided to the Santiago network.

At its third meeting, the Advisory Board of the Santiago network approved the Santiago network managing funding guidelines and requested the interim secretariat to share relevant existing rules and regulations of the co-hosts as they apply to the Santiago network, including relevant financial evaluation processes, and information and process of due-diligence for its consideration at its next meeting.

This document provides a synopsis of relevant UNOPS rules and regulations and how they apply to the Santiago network. Hyperlinks to those that are publicly available are included. This document complements the Santiago network [Guidelines and procedures for responding to requests for technical assistance](#) and the [Guidelines for managing funding](#) and should be reviewed together with the 'Glossary of key terms in the Santiago network guidelines for managing funding (SNAB/2025/04/05)' and the 'Process flow of the Santiago network (technical assistance & managing funding) (SNAB/2025/04/07)'.

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## I. Background

1. Paragraph 26 of the [Santiago network hosting MOU](#), annexed to decision 6/CMA.5, endorsed in decision 2/CP.28, details that ‘the Santiago network Secretariat shall administer, through UNOPS and, where required, UNDRR, in accordance with their respective regulations, rules and procedures, the funds that will be provided to the Santiago network to support technical assistance for the implementation of relevant approaches to averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change in developing countries that are particularly vulnerable to those effects in support of the functions of the Santiago network, including the engagement of appropriate organizations, bodies, networks and experts. The funds will be managed in accordance with the respective regulations and rules of UNOPS and UNDRR, as applicable’.
2. As per the hosting arrangement of the Santiago network Secretariat, UNOPS shall enter into legal obligations and financial commitments on behalf of the Santiago network Secretariat, in consultation with UNDRR, in accordance with UNOPS regulations, rules, policies and procedures. UNOPS shall also be responsible for receiving and managing funds, on behalf of the Santiago network Secretariat, which will be received in accordance with the UNOPS Financial Regulations and Rules and relevant contribution agreements concluded with such Funding Sources.
3. Paragraph 18 of the [Santiago network guidelines for managing funding](#) provided for technical assistance details that ‘the following section contains information on how the Santiago network will manage funding allocated to members to provide technical assistance. Please refer to UNOPS Financial Regulations and Rules and UNOPS Grant Support Operational Instruction for further information.
4. UNOPS operates in accordance with a comprehensive legislative framework consisting of Directives and Instructions. Directives are organization-wide policies that govern actions within UNOPS and its external relations. Instructions explain procedures and business processes for the implementation of Directives, as well as United Nations legislation applicable to UNOPS. UNOPS Directives and Instructions are publicly available on the UNOPS website.
5. The tables below provide a synopsis of relevant UNOPS rules and regulations<sup>1</sup> and a high-level explanation of how they apply to the Santiago network including relevant financial evaluation processes, and information and process of due diligence.
6. This document complements the Santiago network guidelines and procedures for responding to requests for technical assistance and the guidelines for managing funding provided for technical assistance. The present document should be reviewed together with the ‘Glossary of key terms in the Santiago network guidelines for managing funding (SNAB/2025/04/05)’ and the ‘Process flow of the Santiago network (technical assistance & managing funding) (SNAB/2025/04/07)’.
7. The Santiago network Secretariat will assess the adequacy of relevant existing rules and regulations of the Co-hosts as they apply to the Santiago network, based on the experience gained in the facilitation and implementation of technical assistance, and will present to the Advisory Board any necessary recommendations to ensure the effective implementation of the functions of the Santiago network.
