## 1. Meeting details

The sixth meeting of the Advisory Board of the Santiago Network will take place from 24-26 March 2026 in Geneva, Switzerland.

The meeting is open to registered observers and will be facilitated in hybrid mode, allowing registered participants to join virtually or in person. Owing to space limitations, access may be limited for in-person participation and attendance will be subject to confirmation. Hybrid arrangements for virtual participation in the meeting will be available. The deadline for registering as an observer (both in-person and virtual) is Thursday, 12 February 2026. In view of the need to confirm the arrangements as early as possible, registrations received after this deadline may not be processed. ## 2. Meeting venue

## 3. Visas

Visa requirements must be met before arrival to Switzerland and are the sole responsibility of the participant. Based on nationality, participants attending the Advisory Board meeting may require a visa to enter Switzerland. Please see the [Swiss visa website](#) for more information. ## 4. Participant costs

## 5. Flights

## 6. Accommodation

Participants are requested to arrange their own accommodation for their stay in Geneva. Early booking of accommodation is advised. Please see the [Geneva hotel list](#) and the [Geneva tourism website](#) for further information.

## 7. Catering

During the meeting, coffee, tea and water will be available for registered in-person observers.

## 8. Transportation

**Access from the airport:** Geneva Airport (GVA) is conveniently located just 4 km from Geneva's city center. Upon arrival, participants have several transportation options:

- Public Transport: A ticket can be obtained from a machine at the airport.
  - Train: The airport railway station (Gare Aéroport) offers direct connections to Geneva's main station (Gare Cornavin) in about 7 minutes.
  - Bus: TPG buses 5 and 10 connect the airport to the city center in approximately 15 minutes.
- Taxi: A ride to downtown Geneva takes around 15 minutes and costs approximately 35-45 CHF.
- Rideshare & Private Transfers: Uber and other ride-hailing services operate in Geneva.

**Upon booking a hotel in Geneva, a transport card is issued in advance of arrival.** This “Geneva Transport Card” enables you to use public transport free of charge in Geneva for the duration of your stay. ## 9. About Geneva

**Geography:** Geneva is the capital of the Swiss Canton of Geneva and is located in the westernmost corner of Switzerland. The city is situated on the banks of Lake Geneva, at the mouth of the Rhone River and is bordered by the Jura Mountains to the west and the French Alps in the east. The city is easily reached within 2 hours by plane from most major cities in Europe and is a hub of Europe’s highway network. High-speed train connections to Paris and Milan, and fast trains to Spain and Germany provide additional access.

**Language:** Switzerland has four national languages: German, French, Italian and Romansh. French is the predominant language spoken in Geneva, with English widely spoken.

**Time:** GMT/UTC +2

**Telephone Area Code:** +41 for Switzerland and 022 for Geneva

**Electricity:** Electricity in Switzerland is 230 Volts, alternating at 50 cycles per second. Please bring a power plug converter – Switzerland uses a 3-pin outlet system.

**Currency:** The currency in Switzerland is the Swiss Franc (CHF). The Euro is also accepted at most businesses but expect to pay a premium rate. Check [www.xe.com](http://www.xe.com) for the most up-to-date exchange rates. ATMs are widely available.

**Climate:** The climate in Geneva is pleasant most of the year. March in Geneva marks the transition from winter to spring, with cold to cool, brisk, and often changeable weather. Expect daytime low of around 0°C (32°F) to 9°C (49°F) and colder nights at -1°C (30°F) to 3°C (37°F). Rain mixed with snow is possible, so a heavy jacket and an umbrella are recommended.
